3. Membership (Recruit, Retain, Rejuvenate)

What is your Area's membership goal and how are the Clubs aiming to achieve it? For the present reporting period: how close is the Area to reaching this goal?

Between the six clubs the membership goal has been to recruit 18 new members - to date 8 new members have come on stream (during this reporting period) – Clubs are focusing (first and foremost) on **retention** as it makes no sense to bring members in the front door and have them leave out the back. With a solid foundation of programs that engages current members, t clubs have then agreed to zoom in on new members. Basically both can be done in unison t but attention to retention is a big goal of all clubs in my area. Part of the retention strategy will focus also on mentorship.

As Area Director, what have you done to work on this?

As Area Director I was instrumental in recommending a Z Club be chartered in our Hamilton clubs. I attended 2 Z-Club conferences became quite excited and took this energy back to my club. As a result a committee was formed. I was also able to locate a school for the project and am currently seeking out information for the formation of a Golden Z club at McMaster where I do a lot of work. The Z Club School was easy to obtain as my sons attended this school and I knew the teachers well.
