Are Clubs in your Area working on local service projects that advance the status of women? Please give <u>examples</u> of local service projects that advance the status of women during this quarter.

ZC of Aurora- Assist in sales at Ten Thousand Villages, items made by 3rd world countries and sold for a fair price so they can support their families

ZC of Amherst – club provides baby supplies to mothers with babies staying at Gerard House where they will learn to be independent within a 2-year period.

ZC of Batavia-Women's mentoring program "Power UP", volunteering at "My Sister's Closet". Money from sales of used items goes for domestic violence programs.

ZC of Buffalo- TRY Program (Teaching and Restoring Youth) Zonta members spend time with young women mentoring and encouraging youth to be successful in life.

ZC of Cheek/Lanc-The club has done volunteer work for the local domestic violence agency, The Family Justice Center of Erie Co. This includes the delivery and hanging of domestic violence posters in designated areas, which provide information/phone number to contact for victims of domestic violence. This service project also includes volunteering time as an advocate at the Center, providing toys for the children's waiting room and purchasing needed items for victims. The original \$6,000 seed money for the poster project, for the entire county, came from this club.

ZC of Geneva- Habitat for Humanity Project. The club members arranged, planted, and landscaped shrubs and flowers for the Women's Build home in Geneva, NY

ZC of Hamb/OP-Members volunteer for multiple domestic violence agencies in Erie Co. 50% of the club have toured the Family Justice Center and trained to be advocates. Members work on the DV planning committees and sit on boards for two different DV agencies. They also participate in the delivery and posting of DV unit posters in local business restrooms.

ZC of Rochester-"Safe Journey Program" Club members prepared journal for women who are victims of domestic violence (part of the healing process) and assembled bags of toiletries for the Catholic Family Center. The center is a shelter for homeless women.

ZC of Cheektowaga/Lancaster is sponsoring a Z Club at Lancaster HS. These students have taken over the activity of collecting refuge along the roadside as part of the Community Service hours required for graduation.

3. Membership (Recruit, Retain, Rejuvenate)

What is your Area's membership goal and how are the Clubs aiming to achieve it? For the present reporting period: how close is the Area to reaching this goal?

The 8 clubs in Area 4 have been encouraged to increase their membership by one new member and retain the current membership.

From June1 – November 30 Area 4 membership has increase from 176 to 186, which is an increase of 9.5 %.



Clubs that are Increasing:

<u>ZC of Geneva</u> - One very successful ZING! Club increased their membership from 12 up to 16. They have set a goal of 20 members. <u>ZC of Amherst</u>- Increase their membership from 15 to 18 members and are still to increase. <u>ZC of Hamburg/OP</u> - Increased from 24 members up to 27 <u>ZC of Buffalo</u> – Increased from 27 members up to 29 ZC of Rochester- Increased from 25 members up to 26 (also held a ZING!)

Holding and Retaining are:

<u>ZC of Batavia</u>-32 current members and the largest club in Area 4 <u>ZC of Cheek/Lanc</u>- 26 current members

Decrease in Membership:

ZC of Aurora- 12 members down from 15 (1 death)

Yes. Two Z clubs were established in the Fall of 2011. New clubs were established at Batavia High School sponsored by the Zonta Club of Batavia Genesee and a new club at Mt. Mercy Academy in South Buffalo sponsored by the Zonta Club of Hamburg/Orchard Park. The Z Club at Lancaster HS, sponsored by the ZC of Cheektowaga/Lancaster has a new energized advisor at the school.

As Area Director, what have you done to work on this?

I have met with the Zonta liaison for all 3 Z Clubs and have assisted with the location of the Z Club manual on ZI website. Currently working on obtaining gavels for each Z Club.
