## **DISTRICT 4 LAA (CANADA) CONFERENCE REPORT**

In the past Zonta year there has been an increase in the amount of LAA Activities by Clubs in D4. This is true for both sides of the border.

I have continued to do the monthly informercials for the Canadian side of D4. These informercials are also shared with other Zonta Clubs across Canada. The email list I distribute to has also expanded to include more and more members on the US side of D4.

Clubs have invited me to speak and I have visited Toronto and Hamilton. I will be going to Toronto in October.

In the spring my Co-Chair, Bonnie Clesse and I did presentations at two District Spring Workshops. At these workshops Bonnie gathered information regarding activities by individual Clubs regarding LAA.
