Treasurer Report – Cathie Wheeler and Jill Coburn

- 850 paid members as at September 15, 2014
- 8 out of 38 clubs submitted their district dues by June 1st due date
- Treasurer's report as at September 15, 2014 \$8,000 still to spend, biggest expense is convention expenses for Lee and Joanne
- \$9000.00 reserve \$4,000 for 2015 conference and \$5,000 for emergency (eg couldn't collect dues and expenses owed)
- Discussion regarding which committees have travel reimbursement
- Motion: to use \$600.00 of the unrestricted reserve to go towards 8 committees, and add \$600.00 to other committee budget line, moved by Cathie Wheeler, seconded by Julie Brown, Unanimously approved
- Committees now covered with \$200.00 budget Amelia Earhart, Advocacy, UN, Awards, Service, Ambassador, Z clubs and Nominating
- Copy of budget passed around, is attached to these minutes and is posted on the D4 website
- Expense reimbursement guidelines are also found on the website

International Update – Governor Joanne

- President Maria Jose is very cognizant of pressures and demands on everyone, wants reporting to be short and sharp
- One initiative at the International Board meeting held September 19th weekend is re-districting Europe
- Bylaws, lots of suggested changes and removal at convention, takes a lot of time to update bylaws and ensure accuracy, to come up with a clean, updated version on the website, booklet coming for boards and Club Presidents shortly
- Updated mission and vision statements also being discussed, manuals need to be updated ASAP and will then be available
