Helen W. Cleveland – Charter President in 1927 and International President, from 1930 – 1932. Helen was the first female investment Advisor in Canada. She is credited with organizing the first of the European Clubs in Vienna and Hamburg

Margaret P Hyndman – Charter member of the club. Margaret was the second Q. C. in the British Empire. She was awarded the Order of Canada for distinguished service to the Canadian Bar. Margaret fought and won the fight for women to sit on juries, incorporated the Consumer's Association of Canada, represented aboriginal women at the Supreme Court in the question of individual and group rights and established the first legal aid system in Canada.

Dorothy A. Thompson joined the Zonta Club of Toronto in 1929 and remained a committed member until her death at the age of 103. She filled her retirement years by traveling the world and organizing a total of 35 new clubs in such divers countries as Australia, Scotland, Bankok, The Philippines, Africa, Tasmania and Canada.

Holly Anderson - Holly joined the club in 1987 and remains an active member. She is an Amelia Earhart Fellow and has co-chair of the International Amelia Earhart Fellowship Committee sin 1997. Holly is a Professional Engineer working in the Nuclear Industry.
