Here in Peel, at the beginning of 2018, five women were murdered in domestic violence. Their names were: Elaine Believue, Avtar Kaur, Aliocia Lewandowski, Hoden Said and Baljit Thandi. These women were murdered by their intimate partners. The international statistics says that 38% of women report that they have experienced physical of sexual violence by the men in their lives.

Violence in Peel knows no cultural barriers; it takes place at home, in the workplace and in open spaces. Violence against women and girls threatens our Brampton community, inhibits their economic progress, and prevents women and girls from contributing and creating better lives for themselves and their families.

The Zonta Club of Brampton-Caledon would like to make you aware UN program called the 16 days of activism (November 25 to December 10). Zonta International has subsequently established, in 2012, an international advocacy campaign called *Zonta Says No*.
