Have identified 3 new sources for these kits: Olean Club – Uganda Program can take kits. Fellowship Wesleyan Church – Guatemala (100 kits - 1 st trip) and Ann Marie Zonta's group to Nicaragua. World Vision primary distributor for Canadian clubs.
Birthing Kit Assembly	Clubs are participating in assembly. Investigating ways to co-ordinate resources.	Communications to Canadian clubs in December expressing the opportunity for group purchasing. Nita McCown (AD3) is the contact for razor blades at this time.
Free the Girls	Project has gained interest by some USA clubs, but District Service has not designated this as a District Project.	Currently, St. Catherines, Fort Erie and Niagara Falls, ON are showing interest in the project. No specific details on numbers, shipping distributor or dates available.
