Zonta Club of Guelph

President Stephanie Sutherland will remain in her role until 2021. AD Brenda installed new executive at their AGM meeting on May 13th. As with most clubs, the biggest challenge has been obtaining and maintaining new members. Over the course of the year, they inducted 4 new members, and with 2 recent resignations, they should finish the year with 16 members. They have lined up two new inductions for the September meeting. It has been a challenge for the club to get executive. They voted to include a club portion to their dues, which in the past just covered international and district dues.
